



### 1st HANDS HELP

directions on back

### **YOU'LL NEED**

Hand clappers (4 per room)

### 2<sup>nd</sup> SAY WITH ME

all ages

Say Together: My hands help!

## 3<sup>rd</sup> QUESTIONS

ages 4-K

- If you don't feel like helping, who can give you the power to help anyway? God
- 2. Name some things you can do to help with your hands. *Answers will vary.*
- 3. When is it safe to help strangers or people you don't know? When I'm with a grown-up in my family, a teacher, or a leader



Hold up clappers for kids to see.

**Say:** These are helping hands! When we see a friend help someone, we'll shake them and say, "You cared!"

- 2. **Give** the hand clappers to four kids.
- 3. **Pretend** to fall down.

**Say:** Oh no! I fell on the ground! Friends, who will use their helping hands to help me up?

4. Choose a kid to help you up.

**Say:** You showed you're a good friend! Now, let's clap our helping hands and say, "You cared!"

- 5. Everyone **shakes** the hand clappers, **claps** their hands, and **says**, "You cared!"
- 6. Kids with hand clappers **pass** them to another kid.
- 7. **Pretend** to be sad.

**Say:** Uh oh. I'm feeling very sad. Friends, who will help me feel better with a hug?

- 8. Choose a kid to give you a hug.
- 9. Everyone **shakes** the hand clappers, **claps** their hands, and **says**, "You cared!"

**Say:** God wants you to help people because God helps you!

- 10. Say "Say With Me" listed on the front.
- 11. For ages 4-K, **ask** "Questions" listed on the front.







### 1st CUP TO SHARE

directions on back

### **YOU'LL NEED**

Cup (1 per room)

### 2<sup>nd</sup> SAY WITH ME

all ages

Say Together: I give people what they need.

## 3<sup>rd</sup> QUESTIONS

ages 4-K

- When someone needs something, what should you do? Give them what they need.
- 2. What can you do if you don't have what they need? Pray for God to take care of them.
- 3. When is it safe to help strangers or people you don't know? When I'm with a grown-up in my family, a teacher, or a leader



#### **Before Prop Talk**

 Choose another leader to pretend to be really thirsty.

#### **Prop Talk**

Hold up cup for kids to see.

**Say:** Look at this cup. It looks like it's full of a nice drink of water!

2. Another leader **pretends** they can't talk, **coughs**, and **acts** thirsty.

**Say:** Oh, friends! Look at <u>thirsty leader's name</u>! How are they feeling right now?

3. Kids **respond**. Suggest the leader is thirsty if kids need it.

**Say:** They do look like they might be feeling thirsty. Do we have what they need to feel better?

4. Kids respond.

**Say:** Yes, we do! We have this drink! Let's show thirsty leader's name that we care by sharing this drink with them!

- 5. **Choose** a kid to **take** the cup to the thirsty leader.
- 6. Thirsty leader takes the cup, pretends to drink from it, and says, "Thank you! That's just what I needed!"

**Say:** When people need something, we give it to them to show we care. And if we don't have what they need, we can pray for them!

- 7. Say "Say With Me" listed on the front.
- 8. For ages 4-K, **ask** "Questions" listed on the front.





# THROUGH THE ROOF

### 1st SHARING BEAR

directions on back

### **YOU'LL NEED**

Teddy bear (1 per room)

### 2<sup>nd</sup> SAY WITH ME

all ages

Say Together: God helps me care and share

# 3<sup>rd</sup> QUESTIONS

ages 4-K

- What can you do when you don't feel like sharing? Pray to God. Ask Him to help me care and share.
- 2. Will God help you care and share when you ask Him to? Yes
- 3. When is it safe to help strangers or people you don't know? When I'm with a grown-up in my family, a teacher, or a leader



1. Hold up teddy bear for kids to see.

**Say:** This teddy bear is all MINE. I really like it, so I'm NOT gonna share it. Do you think that's okay?

- 2. Kids answer.
- B. Hold teddy bear close, as if you'll never share.

**Say:** I heard you say I should share, but I still don't feel like it. What can I do?

4. Kids answer.

**Say:** You had some good ideas. I think the best idea is to pray. God can help me care and share. Help me pray, friends.

5. Everyone **bows** their heads and **closes** their eyes.

**Pray:** God, please help me be a good friend by helping me care and share. In Jesus' name, amen!

Say: I'm feeling so much better! Now I can share!

6. Give the bear to a child near you.

**Say:** Let's ALL care and share. We'll say, "God helps me care and share," while we pass the bear around!

- Chant together, "God helps me care and share."
- 8. Pass the bear to as many kids as possible.
- 9. Say "Say With Me" listed on the front.
- 10. For ages 4-K, **ask** "Questions" listed on the front.

### 1st GOD'S LOVE

### **YOU'LL NEED**

Heart toy (1 per room)

### 2<sup>nd</sup> SAY WITH ME

all ages

Say Together: I share God's love.

# 3<sup>rd</sup> QUESTIONS

ages 4-K

- 1. Should you keep God's love all to yourself, or share God's love with others? Share God's love with others.
- 2. **Why do we share God's love with others?** So God's love can make them better
- 3. When is it safe to help strangers or people you don't know? When I'm with a grown-up in my family, a teacher, or a leader



1. Hold up heart toy for kids to see.

**Say:** Pretend this heart is God's love. God's love makes us feel all better!

2. Hug the heart and smile.

**Say:** Let's pretend we're very sad. Show your saddest face. Let me see you cry a little ...

3. Kids make sad faces, pretend to cry, etc.

**Say:** Should I share God's love with you to help you feel all better, or should I keep God's love to myself?

4. Kids answer.

**Say:** You're right. The Bible tells me I need to share God's love if I wanna be a good friend, so I'm gonna do it!

- 6. Give the heart to a leader.
- 7. Leader **makes** a very happy face.

**Say:** Look! When I shared God's love with them, it made them feel all better! Now let's all have a turn.

8. Pass the heart to as many kids as possible.

**Say:** When we share God's love with our sad friends, it makes them feel ALL better!

- 9. Say "Say With Me" listed on the front.
- 10. For ages 4-K, **ask** "Questions" listed on the front.
